- Items of focus for Summer 2023 that we made strong progress on:
- Continuing to make progress toward the Action Plan Agreement that President Reveley signed and presented to C.H.A.N.G.E., continues to be an important priority. During the summer we made progress toward this on a number of different fronts. Two items that I wanted to spotlight are the following;
- Multicultural Center: We continue to make progress toward identifying new space for a Multicultural Center. Space has been identified and we are continuing to work with the necessary campus partners to build out a timeline of when we will be able to begin occupying the space.
- Student Survey: A group of campus colleagues met during the latter part of the spring 2023 semester and into the summer to continue work toward developing a survey tool to deploy to campus. Good progress is being made and the survey will be deployed in early 2024.
- Some exciting changes from our Longwood Dining Services Team:
- Welcome to Greens 2 Go in Upchurch
- Kudos to renovations at Chick-fil-A that have resulted in good efficiency for customers.
- Excited for the new reusable to-go containers at D-Hall that are larger. You can purchase one for \$5.
- The first Dine with the Director of the semester will be held on September 26, at
 5:30 p.m. in the Nance Room of the Dorrill Dining Hall.

- Campus Internet Upgrades: We have entered into a new contract with Glo Fiber, a subsidiary of Shentel to provide campus internet and video services. In an effort to prioritize expanded Wi-Fi service, we are ending our cable contract for our residence halls & apartment spaces when the current contract concludes in December of 2023. I will send out an email to campus on the morning of August 30. Below are the details regarding the expanded Wi-Fi service for campus including our residence halls & apartment spaces:
- Enhanced Speed: 100/100 Mbps internet service (wired and Wi-Fi currently at 25Mbps)
- Expanded coverage area: Fewer "dead zones"
- Increase Access: Up to 10 devices/student
- Additional service redundancy: Reduced maintenance downtime
- 24/7/365 Shentel support to Longwood University

 - New position and parking services were split up among different offices

 - Who is in charge of accessibility parking spots?
 - Lot space reallocation is not just this office, but has to work with other departments, but can be brought to the office to get the concern to the right offices
 - What about not having enough spots for the amount of spots (needed)? Concerns with the freshman overflow lot and upper class man not having spots?
 - More freshman are realizing that they are allowed to bring their cars to Longwood and this year we focused on credit hours of who was eligible for parking passes (25 credits or less considered a freshman) this caused more "freshman"
 - The new housing policy has caused a drastic increase in Lancer Park residents and since they get commuter passes they have heard complaints that there aren't enough spots when coming back at night, have been looking to appeal and has talked with LUPD that if a commuter pass student is parked in an inappropriate spot, to leave them alone
 - What about adding numbered spots in LP?
 - My team has discussed this, but when looking at the services needed it can cause problems
 - Used to do this approach but it caused more issues than solving the issue for townhouse owners and apartment owners
 - LP residents used to just have lancer park permits and only commuters had commuter passes
 - Sorority parking?
 - LUPD has been notified not to ticket from 5pm-10pm on Sundays during chapter meetings for the next month and it is a trial run
 - The concern is for people to leave at the certain time

- Why are Cox and Registrar lots not residential lots?
 - Try to commend to commuters who have classes in those popular buildings
- Wheeler lot being turned into a commuter lot?
 - Definitely can be considered, but it is important for faculty members because it is the only big lot available on that end of campus and Wheeler lot is reserved quite frequently for events on campus
 - It is really beneficial to faculty and staff who come here everyday
- Parking pass being in with tuition
 - Working on getting tickets on the student account and when moved with a new parking system didn't allow it at the time, but working with them right now to get it on a student account
 - Will work with students and accommodate students who can not pay right at that time and waiting for a refund check to come in
 - The permits are still a work in progress- getting it on students' accounts
- Why are the prices the way they are?
 - They have been like this for years and it has always been this way
 - Work with students to get refunds for half if your situation changes
 - The parking passes help pay for the lots themselves and the parking system itself
